



The Hand of Fatima traces the development and symbolism ascribed to the hand motif in the Arab and Islamic world, and beyond. It traces the journey of the *khamsa* into the contemporary world of social and fine art, including museum highlights. Special sections are dedicated to the *khamsa* in Algeria; cultural crossover in Spain, Portugal, and Brazil; and the symbol of the hand in Shiʿism.
