-Description:

In Spain, after the short experience of the 1812 Liberal Constitution, began the new

political period of Liberalism in the 1830's. In 1833 Ferdinand the VIIth died and began

the Constitutional Monarchy with the Queen Isabel II. The parliament with the Camera

of Commons was the new space to deal with public affairs, politics and public sphere.

But in my opinion the Parliament was not the exclusive neither the more important

place to do politics for the MP's. I consider that gentleman's clubs and different

associations of the gentlemanly capitalism played a very important role in that political

adaptation. It was a part of the transformation process from Ancient Regime to

Liberalism. Among the different ways for adapting to the new system, here we study the

sociability spaces as places where the members of parliament could develop politics in

an informal way. Spanish Casinos were a place to do networks between MP's, to speak

about politics (even when it was banned) and also the place to take political decisions.

A gentleman's Club was the ideal place to begin such deals in a casual way, try to reach

an agreement and arrange compromises which afterwards could appear as an official

deal in the parliament. To summarize, here we study the links between Casinos and

parliamentarians in XIXth Century in Spain.
