MINUTES

of the meeting of 19 September 2013, 15.00 – 18.30, Room: ASP A3E-2 and 20 September 2013, 9.00 – 12.30, Room: ASP A3G-2

Brussels

The meeting opened at 15.05 with Michael Gahler in the chair

1. Adoption of agenda (AP101.518)

The agenda was adopted.

2. Approval of minutes of the meeting of 15 June 2013 (AP101.389)

The minutes were approved with one correction in point 4. Ana Rita Geremias Sithole was added to the speakers who presented the draft report.

3. Co-Chair's announcements

The Co-Chair informed the committee of the following decisions taken by the JPA Bureau concerning the 26th session of the ACP-EU Joint Parliamentary Assembly, to be held from 25 to 27 November 2013 in Addis Ababa (Ethiopia):

- Subjects of urgent motions for resolutions
 - Security in the Great Lakes region
 - The situation in the Comoros archipelago

The deadline for tabling motions for resolutions on these two subjects was set for 12.00 on Tuesday 22 October.

Workshops

- Housing development programme to ensure urban sustainability in Ethiopia
- Micro and small enterprises development in creating job opportunities for youth and women

- Keynote debate:
 - Institutional cooperation between the African Union and the European Union
- Exchange of views with the Ethiopian authorities:
 - Green growth economy in ensuring sustainable development in Ethiopia
- Debates without resolution:
 - The attainment of MDGs in Africa
 - Towards a new governance in the financing of development, with three sub-items:
 - o the use of natural resources
 - o fiscal reform and the redistribution of wealth
 - o decentralised cooperation
 - The fight against female genital mutilation

The Co-Chair informed the Committee of the Bureau decision of 18 September to propose two new amendments to the Rules of Procedure. In accordance with Article 35 of the Rules of Procedure of the ACP-EU Joint Parliamentary Assembly, such amendments are decided by the Assembly on the basis of proposals from the Bureau, having consulted the Committee on Political Affairs.

The deadline for tabling amendments to the proposals of the Bureau was set at 24 October 2013 at noon. Possible amendments would be submitted to the vote at the meeting of the Committee on Political Affairs of 23 November 2013 in Addis Ababa.

4. Respect for the rule of law and the role of an impartial and independent judiciary Co-Rapporteurs: Dharamkumar Seeraj (Guyana) and Filip Kaczmarek

Exchange of views

5. ACP and EU, partners in crisis management operations?

- Presentation by Jo Coelmont, Senior Associate Fellow Egmont The Royal Institute for International Relations
- Exchange of views

Jo Coelmont analysed the impact and effectiveness of the EU crisis management operations in Africa since 2001 and stressed the importance of conflict prevention, the need for a comprehensive approach and for a longer term common EU-Africa vision on security which should benefit to both sides.

José Costa Pereira (EEAS) highlighted political dialogue meetings between the ACP States and the European Union, held in the frame of Article 8 of the Cotonou Agreement, in 11 different ACP countries since the last meeting of the Committee on Political Affairs.

Vincent Ringenberg (EEAS) summarised the actions taken as a follow-up to the resolution on the threats posed again by military coups on democracy and political stability in the ACP countries and the role of the international community adopted at the 25th session of the Assembly, held in Brussels from 17 to 19 June 2013. This follow-up notably covered sanctions, the follow-up of the findings of elections observation missions and the reinforcement of the International Criminal Court.
