

## SHORT JUSTIFICATION

On 16 November 2000<sup>1</sup> the Council approved the conclusion of the Agreement on cooperation in science and technology between the European Community and the Government of the Russian Federation. The Agreement was concluded to encourage, develop and facilitate cooperation between the parties in research and technology development area. Furthermore, the Council approved the renewals of the Agreement for an additional period of five years in 2003<sup>2</sup> and 2009<sup>3</sup> in its current form.

In its Proposal for a Council Decision<sup>4</sup>, dated 14 August 2013, the Commission proposes the renewal of the Agreement for an additional period of five years with the content of the renewed Agreement being identical to the content of the Agreement which expires on 20 February 2014. On 18 october 2013 the Council requests the Parliament to give its consent to the renewal of the agreement<sup>5</sup>.

The current renewal takes into account recommendations issued by independent experts from the European Union and the Russian Federation. The review<sup>6</sup> was performed by two experts from the European Commission and two experts from the Russian Ministry of Education and Science between November 2012 and March 2013. The experts state that science and technology cooperation between EU and Russia should be continued and further intensified and they recommend the prolongation of the Agreement for the next term without any changes to its text. In addition, the prolongation of the Agreement is linked to the official start of the "EU-Russia Year of Science 2014".

Total planned expenditure for the period of five years (2014-2019) is EUR 0.550 million. This expenditure is intended mainly to finance the servicing of the Agreement as well as workshops, seminars and joint meetings of officials and experts from both parties in Europe and Russia. Although the Committee on Budgets does not see any impediments to the renewal of the Agreement, it would like to insist that the Commission monitors carefully that the funds are spent in accordance with principles of sound financial management, namely principles of economy, efficiency and effectiveness and that actual scientists and researchers are actively participating in the programme and not only research administrators.
